## **Director's Report**

2. Manager's Report – Jay Atwood SECOMM has 12 vacancies. Seven are well into the hiring process. We hope to have several candidates for an academy in January. Nine are in pre-certification stages.

The data channel will continue to operate intermittently due to multiple staff members out sick. This is not expected to be an ongoing issue.

SECOMM Training and Employee Development Manager Aimee Fournier-Plante was acknowledged for taking the lead in overhauling SECOMM's criteria-based dispatch system. This is what dispatch uses to provide pre-arrival instructions during medical emergencies. An oversight committee assisted in the revamp of the program and the first class with these changes was very successful.

An evacuation drill was conducted this morning to ensure dispatch could continue services should the BCES building need to be evacuated. It went very well. To better that process, staff looked at using a space at Kennewick Police Department to establish a more robust location until we can come to a conclusion on a fully redundant back-up center.

Some issues were identified at the Prosser Butte radio site during Red Mountain testing. Water from a leaking roof substantially damaged some of our radio equipment. We are working with WCIA (Washington Cities Insurance Authority) to file a claim to get the damaged equipment replaced or repaired.

4. Radio System Project Overview

Motorola promised to have the final proposal for the infrastructure piece to us next Thursday. This will provide a better idea of what the top-end of the infrastructure costs look like, with and without the 3 downtown sites.

Richland Assistant City Manager Drew Florence talked about the radio project and how it was going to be funded. Initially we were looking at financing through Motorola. With the project estimated at \$25 - \$30 million, it's too much for Richland to solely sign off on. Richland worked with a bond counselor to draft a finance supplement that identifies the Big 5 as having an equal obligation of the financing through Motorola. The draft should be completed in the next couple of weeks. Agency attorneys are also working on revising the ILA for the radio project as well as addressing language specific to public records as previously noted by Richland City Attorney Heather Kintzley.

5. November/December Meeting Dates

As these regular meetings fall on the holidays, there is a need to choose new meeting date(s). The Board decided to schedule a single special meeting on December 12, 2024. Cancellations and a new appointment will be forthcoming.

6. Legislature Invitation

Franklin County Commissioner Stephen Bauman asked regional legislators to come together this afternoon for an overview of the microwave project, BCES as a standalone agency and the radio system in an effort to secure some help with these projects. The meeting is today at 4 p.m. at BCES and Board members were encouraged to attend if possible.
